Five Most Dangerous Places to Be a Christian...

The Christian persecution we read about in the Bible is not a thing of the past. It still exists. And today, in the 21st Century, we are living in a time when persecution against Christian believers is the highest in modern history. We need to pray for our brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Here are the five most dangerous places to be a Christian—countries where saying **yes** to following Jesus is truly a life-or-death decision.

- I. North Korea: Christians are seen as hostiles in this society and, therefore, must be eradicated. Pray that the new diplomatic efforts would mean a lessening of pressure and violence against Christians.
- **2. Afghanistan**: Afghanistan is once again a close second behind North Korea on the 2019 World Watch List. An Islamic state, the country does not permit any faith other than Islam to exist. To convert to a faith outside Islam is tantamount to treason because it's seen as a betrayal of family and country.
- **3. Somalia:** Estimates suggest that 99 percent of Somalis are Muslims, and any minority religions are heavily persecuted. The Christian community is small and under constant threat of attack.
- **4. Libya:** After the ouster of former dictator Muammar Gaddafi, Libya plunged into chaos and anarchy, which has enabled various Islamic militant groups to control parts of the country. Libyan Christians face continual abuse and violence for their decision to follow Christ.
- **5. Pakistan:** Under Pakistan's notorious blasphemy laws, Christians live in daily fear that they will be accused of blasphemy—which can carry a death sentence.


